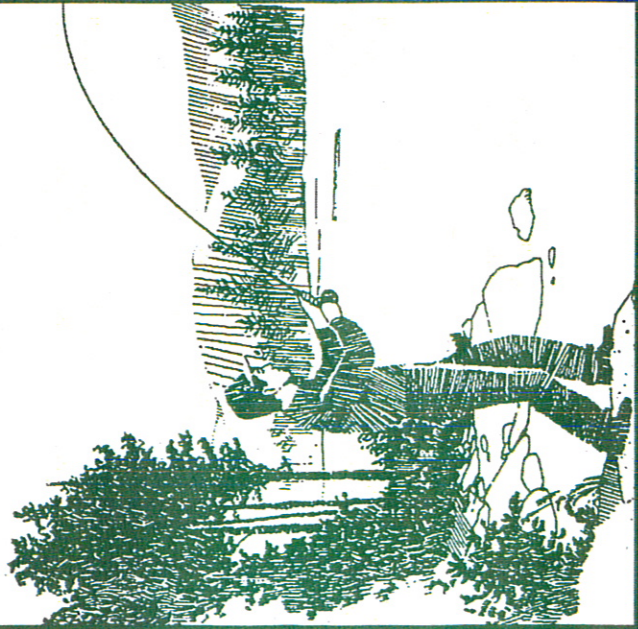

Values

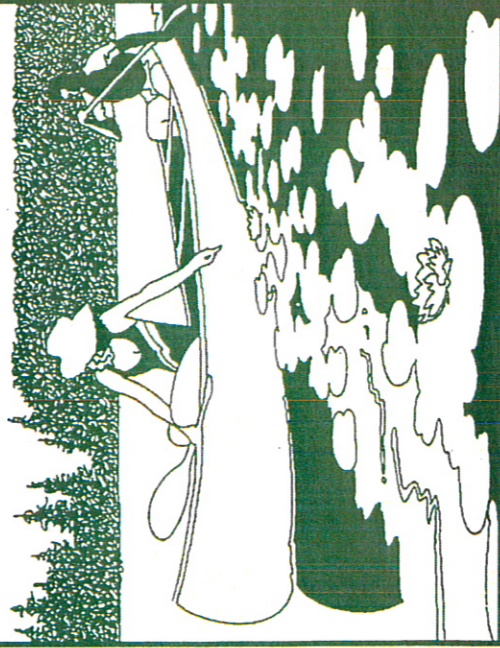
- We value our precious Chemung and Susquehanna Rivers.

Carantouan Opportunities

Wildwood Reserve

East of Waverly directly off 17C onto Shepard Road for about 1/4 mile. Nature trails, bird-watching and fishing (catch and release recommended). A tree walk brochure is available at local libraries.

Forbidden Path

In the village of Waverly, north of RR tracks at Rt. 220 and Chemung St. A short hiking path toward what is known as Carantouan Springs.

River Road

Begins in village of Waverly, north of RR tracks at Rt. 220. One way road along the Chemung River which is an excellent 2 mile roller blade or bike path.

Sayre Susquehanna Trail

Enter at Sayre Riverfront Park and hike the 1/4 mile loop along the river's edge. Watch for poison ivy.
